About the Avian and Exotic Pet Medicine Service

The Avian and Exotic Service at AMC provides 7-day/week veterinary care for a busy and varied caseload consisting of birds, small mammals, reptiles, amphibians, and some fish. The clinician will join a service presently consisting of one full-time ABVP board-certified veterinarian (Reptiles) and 2 part-time ABVP board-certified veterinarians (Avian), and 1 per diem clinician. The Service also includes one Specialty Intern, 2 full-time technicians, 2 full-time assistants, and 1 service coordinator.

Primary Job Responsibilities

In a 4-day work week, clinical responsibilities will consist of clinical appointments daily including one day of weekend duties, training of interns and/or residents, and service coverage. No on-call emergency duty is required. The Avian and Exotic Pet Service is fully integrated with other services at the AMC and works in coordination with other specialists to provide optimal patient care. Requirements for this position are either board-certification by ACZM or by ABVP in Exotic Companion Mammal, Avian, or Reptile and Amphibian Practice. Residents in the last year of an accredited training program who will be board-eligible upon graduation will also be considered.
