The University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign Veterinary Teaching Hospital invites applications for a full- time, 12month appointment, Clinical Assistant Professor, Lecturer or Instructor depending upon qualifications and experience, in the Wildlife Medicine Service within the Community outreach, Urgent/convenient care, Primary care, and Wildlife Service (CUPAWS) section. The service has close collaboration with the Zoological Medicine Service at the Veterinary Teaching Hospital, in total consisting of 4 onsite faculty, 2 off site faculty, 3 onsite house officers (2 ACZM residents and 1 specialty intern), 2 off site house officers (2 ACZM residents), and 3 dedicated technicians. This collective team delivers core and elective courses across all four years of the professional curriculum, has large and diverse research programs, serves client and institutionally owned animals and the medical needs of injured and abandoned wildlife, as well as delivers educational programs for clients and veterinarians locally, nationally and internationally. The service recently moved into a new clinic with onsite digital radiography, ultrasonography, clinical laboratory space, dedicated examination rooms, surgical suite, dentistry suite, and species-specific wards.

Professional opportunities: The College maintains a full-service 230,000 sq. ft. state-of-the-art hospital for farm, companion, and zoological companion animals that supports, engages, and advances the teaching and research activities of the college. In 2009, the College also established the Chicago Center for Veterinary Medicine, which serves as the College's headquarters for teaching, research, and public engagement initiatives in the Chicago area and in 2020, the College established the South Clinic, where the Wildlife Medical Clinic shares the clinical space with the Primary Care, Urgent Care, and Zoological Medicine services. Over the past 2 years, the Veterinary Teaching Hospital has made large investments in infrastructure including installment of new magnetic resonance imaging and computed tomography units, a state-of-the art linear accelerator and integrated anesthetic and surgical suites. The Wildlife Medical Clinic (WMC) embraces a threefold mission to provide veterinary care to sick or injured wild animals, to educate veterinary student and wildlife professionals about wildlife medicine, and to promote conservation initiatives and ecosystem health through collaborative research, dissemination of scientific information, and public education programs. In this effort, the WMC cares for approximately 2,000 native Illinois wildlife, maintains nine non-releasable ambassador animals for outreach and training events, and has a volunteer base of approximately 130 students annually.

We are seeking a candidate who is a strong team player and interested in utilizing and developing their clinical and teaching skills in a healthy, collaborative, busy and vibrant clinical teaching environment. The ideal candidate would be committed to this opportunity for professional development and advancement.

Duties: This position is a 100% appointment in the Department of Veterinary Clinical Medicine. The appointment will be full time and will be a non-tenured, academic position. The primary responsibilities associated with this position will be to serve as Director of the Wildlife Medical Clinic and provide in-house care for wildlife rehabilitation patients as well as student, intern, and resident instruction in the care of these patients. Occasional clinical coverage of zoo ambulatory and companion zoological patients, including care of hospitalized patients as well as scheduled emergency care on weeknights, weekends and holidays is also expected. Emergency duties will be shared with fellow faculty in an equitable manner and there is an expectation that the person in this position will provide training and oversight to veterinary students as well as house officers. The successful applicant will also be responsible for delivering, in conjunction with the faculty in Zoological Medicine and Clinical Skills Learning Center teams, introductory clinical laboratories in the first and second year of the professional curriculum. In addition, collaborative delivery of instruction in the third-year core didactic and fourth year core clinical rotations will be expected. Faculty members are expected to perform the full range of designated faculty responsibilities including teaching, diagnostic/clinical service, outreach/public engagement and university service. Normal teaching responsibilities can include didactic, laboratory, and clinical teaching of discipline to professional students, interns, residents, and graduate students. Your contact hours of lecture and laboratory teaching can vary depending on the needs of the curriculum. Didactic assignments can occur during either on-clinic time or off-clinic time depending on the scheduling sequence of the four-year professional curriculum.
